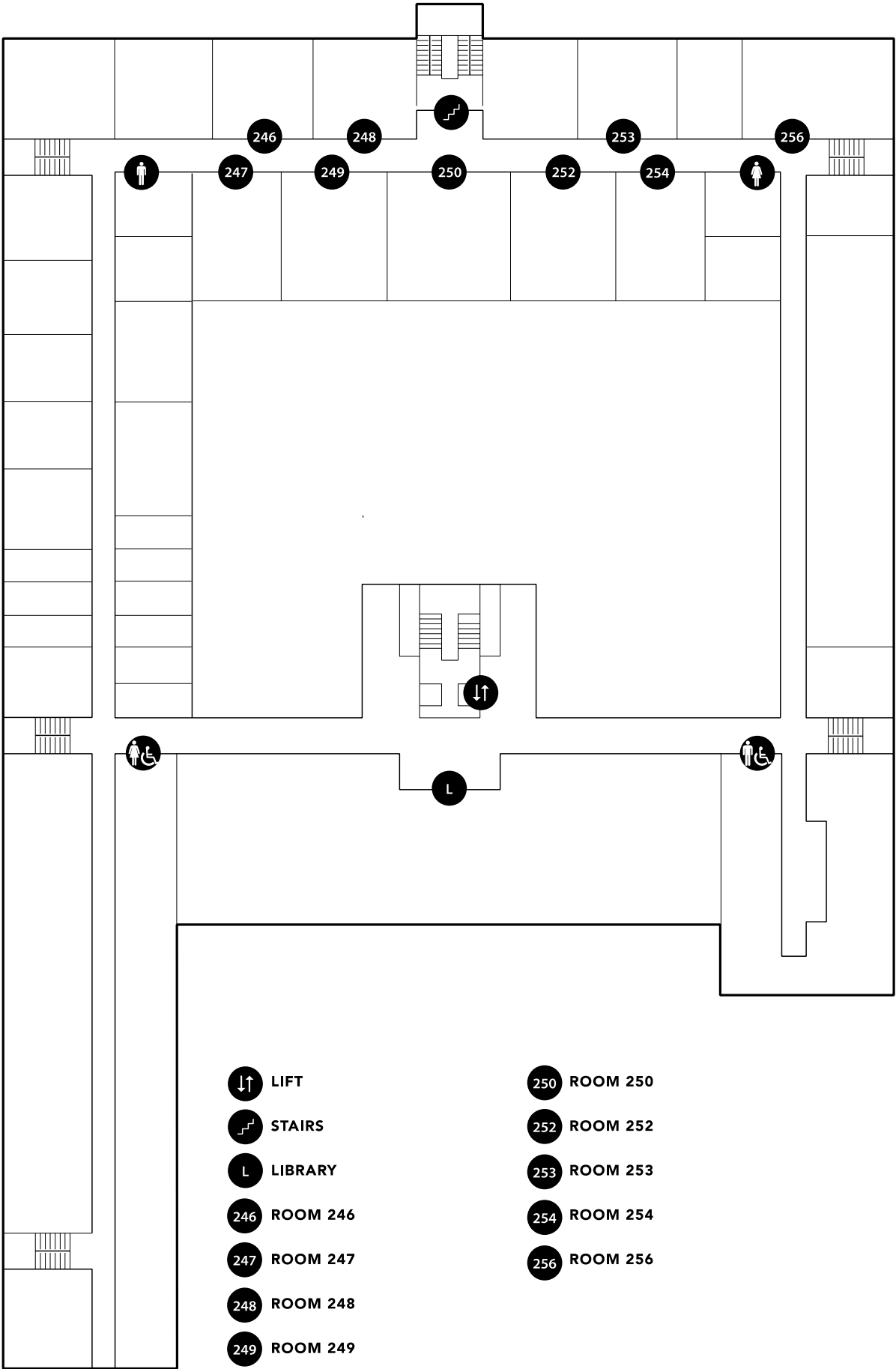
Floor 0 – Map
